

Chino Hills State Park

Since the Park's inception in the early 1980's conservationists and interested citizens have been partnering towards the preservation of Chino Hills State Park (CHSP) and adjacent parklands. The Park's rolling hills form the backbone of the globally significant 31-mile long Puente-Chino Hills Wildlife Corridor.

Over 14,100 acres of permanently protected parklands within the Park, serves as a safe haven to a unique array of plants and animals. The Chino Hills State Park Interpretive Association is diligently working to protect the resources within the Park by helping visitors understand that only careful stewardship will help maintain this wonderful landscape.

Chino Hills State Park also provides an opportunity for visitors to enjoy a beautiful, healthy and natural setting that is close to home.

Park Resources

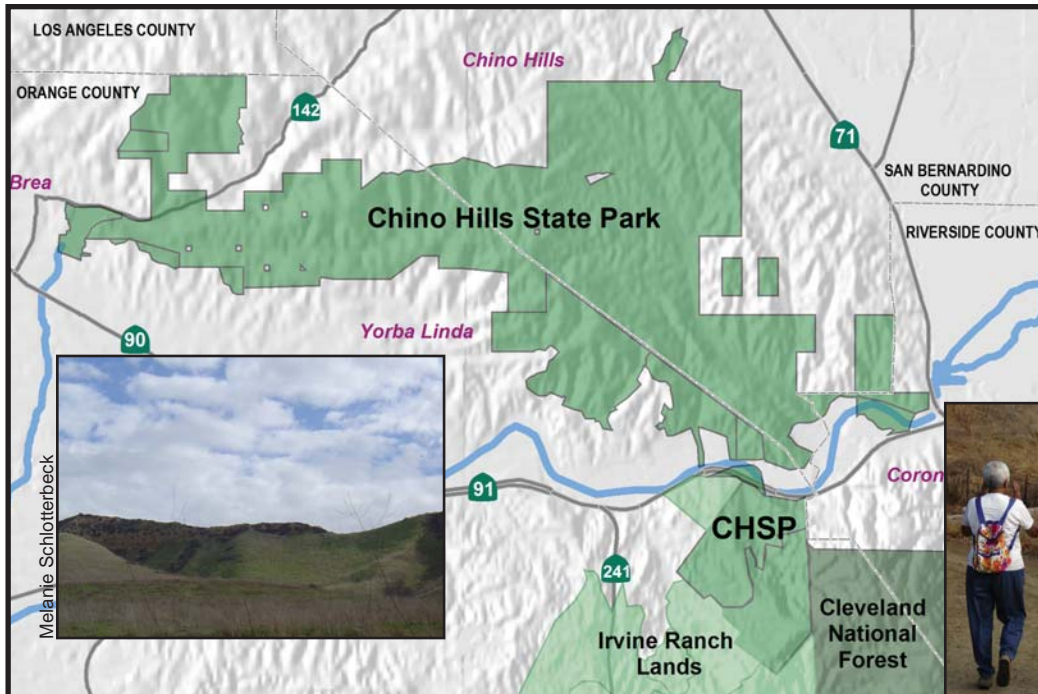

Ongoing efforts seek to preserve additional lands surrounding the Park in order to expand the Park and maintain its vistas and biological health for the future.



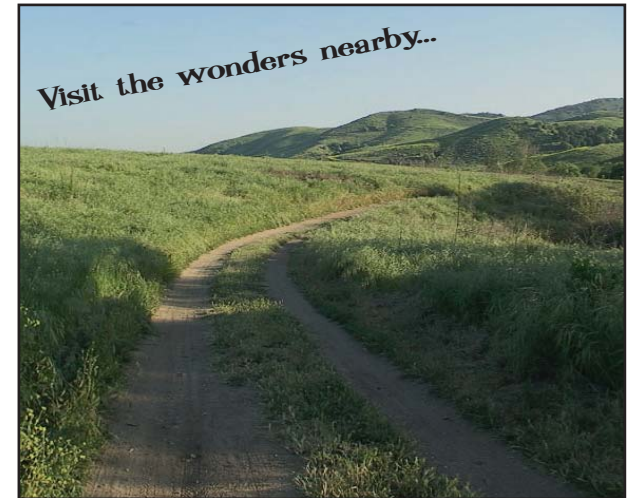
